Romans 6:1-2

"1 What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase? 2 May it never be! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?"

Romans 6:2b

"2 ... How shall we who died to sin still live in it?"

The Christian is no longer responsive to sin.

J. B. Philips translation

<u>Verse 7</u> – "a dead man can safely be said to be immune to the power of sin."

<u>Verse 11</u> – "Dead to the appeal and power of sin."

Romans 6:11-13

"11 Even so consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus. 12 Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts, 13 and do not go on presenting the members of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness; but present yourselves to God as those alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God."

The	Christian	should	die	to	sin.

Romans 6:12

"12 Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts."

Romans 6:13a

"13 and do not go on presenting the members of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness...."

The Christian is dying to sin day by day.

The Christian cannot continue to sin, because he has renounced it.

The Christian has died to sin's guilt.

"2b ...How shall we who died to sin still live in it?"

Verse 10

"10 For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God."

Verse 11

"11 Even so consider yourselves to be <u>dead to</u> <u>sin</u>, but alive to God in Christ Jesus."
