Justification

A one-time event done by God whereby the sinner is declared righteous because of Christ

Sanctification

Is the process whereby the renewed and forgiven sinner is made to become holy while contending with fleshly corruption.

Romans 6:3-4

"3 Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? ⁴ Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life."

- 1. *Bapto* means dip or immerse.
- 2. <u>Baptizo</u> may mean the same, but it also has other meanings and always delineated a change that took place.
